

Mr Tense's Very Routine Life

Mr Tense does the same things at the same time **every single** day.

He spreads his toast with butter — **never margarine** — makes his tea, and opens the paper straight to the TV page.

"Let's see... ah yes, my favourite show *Wheel of Fortune* starts at 8 o'clock as usual. It finishes at 8:30, just in time for the Weekly Lottery Show... and then the nine o'clock news at, of course, nine o'clock. Perfect. Nice and routine. Just how I like it."

Suddenly, everything goes wrong.

Mr Tense freezes.

"What do I do now? Do I butter the toast first? Do I make my tea? Do I wait for the paper? How do I know if *Wheel of* Fortune starts at eight again tonight?"
